INSTRUCTION FOR - VEGETABLE PRINTING COMPETITION

1. **Bring one or two vegetables** suitable for printing, such as **Lady's finger, lemon, onion, capsicum, corn, or any other vegetable according to your creativity.**
2. Vegetables will be **cut/prepared by the teacher or an adult** for safe printing.
3. Each child should bring the paint needed along with the accessories to do the art work. (The image to do printing will be provided by the school as mentioned above).
4. Children should **dip the vegetable gently in the paint** and make creative prints on the paper.
5. Children may create any variety of art design mentioning the states or direction or landforms or water bodies **or any imaginative design** using vegetable prints that highlights their creative work.
6. Encourage children to use **different colours and creative patterns.**
7. Children should try to **keep their artwork neat and clean.**
8. **Do not use too much paint**, as it may smudge the prints.
9. Children should complete their artwork **within the allotted time.**
10. The artwork should be **the child's own creation.**

 Use of Vegetable Prints	Uses the vegetable pieces effectively to create clear and interesting prints. Demonstrates understanding of the printing technique.	10
 Neatness & Finishing	Artwork is reasonably neat and well-finished. Paint is handled carefully with minimal smudging or unnecessary marks.	10
 Overall Presentation	The completed artwork looks attractive, balanced, and complete. The child demonstrates enthusiasm and independent participation.	10
